Colonel Edgar G. Arroyo is a 1997 graduate of the University of Puerto Rico, Mayaguez Campus with a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology. Upon graduation, he received his commission through the Reserve Officers' Training Corps (ROTC) as a Second Lieutenant and branched Medical Service Corps. He is a graduate of the Army Medical Department Officer Basic Course, the Combined Logistics Captain Careers Course, the Combined Arms Services and Staff School, Air Assault School, Airborne School, Jumpmaster School, the Command and General Staff College, and the United States Army War College.

Prior to his arriving at the 65th Medical Brigade, COL Arroyo was assigned as Chief of Staff of Medical Readiness Command, Pacific – Honolulu, Hawaii. Previous non-command assignments include service as Platoon Leader and Company XO, 560th Medical Company (Ground Ambulance), 52nd Air Evacuation Battalion, 18th Medical Command, Camp Humphreys, Korea; Medical Platoon Leader, 3-67th Armor Battalion, 2nd BCT, 4th ID(M), Fort Cavazos, Texas; Medical Plans and Operations Officer, 7th Special Forces Group (Airborne), Fort Liberty, North Carolina, where he deployed twice in support of Operation Enduring Freedom; Battalion S3, 6th Medical Logistics Management Center, Fort Detrick, Maryland; Battalion SPO and later XO, 56th Multifunctional Medical Battalion, Joint Base Lewis McChord, Washington, where he deployed in support of Operation Unified Response - Haiti; Brigade S3, 62nd Medical Brigade, Joint Base Lewis McChord, Washington, where he deployed in support of Operation New Dawn; Joint Medical Operations Officer, U.S. Central Command, MacDill Air Force Base, Florida; Executive Officer to the Deputy Commanding General - Operations, U.S. Army Medical Command, JBSA Fort Sam Houston, Texas; and G-3/5/7, U.S. Army Medical Logistics Command in Fort Detrick, Maryland.
