

Reservations

Pet travel aboard AMC aircraft is only authorized for owners traveling on PCS orders. Owners are permitted to make reservations for two pets through their Commercial Travel Office (CTO). Have your pet's breed and size with you when making your reservation.

No earlier than 15 days prior to your departure, you may check with your CTO for additional available pet reservations if you require transportation for a third pet.

Pets MUST travel with the pet owner on AMC aircraft. If you are unable to bring your pet with you on your flight for whatever reason, you are responsible for coordinating alternate commercial transportation for the animal.

All pets traveling must have a reservation, regardless of whether they are traveling In-Cabin or in the Pet Compartment.

Pets are not permitted outside of their container inside the Osan Passenger Terminal. A designated pet relief area is available near the terminal exercising animals before or after their flight.

The information in this pamphlet is intended to act as a supplement to the AMC Pet Brochure. Please refer to the links listed in the pamphlet to access additional information.

Required Documents

Much like you require certain documents to travel out of Korea, there are certain documents required for your cat or dog to fly out on the Patriot Express.

In accordance with Korean Law*, all dogs and cats departing Korea must have the following original documents:

- A) Rabies Certificate-Must be current and contain the animal's identifying microchip number. The duration of immunization (i.e. 1-year or 3-year vaccine) must not expire while in transit.
- B) United States Health Certificate, DD Form 2209-Must be issued within **10 days** of departure. Contact your local Veterinary Treatment Facility for an appointment for your pets.
- C) Korean Inspection Certificate from the Korean Animal Quarantine Office-Must be obtained from the QIA office at Incheon Airport or Pyeongtaek Port only. You must bring:
 - The animal
 - Traveler's passport
 - E-Ticket for the flight
 - Rabies Certificate
 - US Health Certificate
 - Won to cover any fees
 - 10,000 won per certificate

These requirements are only to LEAVE Korea. Please consult with your Veterinary Treatment Facility and Transportation Office on specific entry requirements for your final destination as soon as you know you are moving.

*As of 1 April 2016. As law is subject to change, owners are responsible for verifying they are in compliance with the most current requirements.

Kennels/Shipping Containers

PET COMPARTMENT CONTAINERS


Only hard containers are permitted in the pet compartment. Containers cannot be custom made, wooden, or wire mesh. Two-piece kennels must be bolted together with metal screws or zip ties, not plastic snaps. The container must not have an opening on the top.

IN-CABIN CONTAINERS

In-Cabin containers may be hard plastic or soft sided made with leak-proof/water repellent padded nylon. Mesh ventilation is required on at least two sides. In-Cabin containers must not exceed 20"L x 16"Wx 8.5"H.

CONTAINER SIZING

Pets must be able to stand-up, turn around, and lie down with normal posture and body movement. Visit the International Air Transportation Association's Pet Corner at www.iata.org/whatwedo/cargo/live-animals/pets/Pages/index.aspx for information on selecting the correct container for you pet. **WE WILL DENY FLIGHT TO ANIMALS WHO DO NOT HAVE A LARGE ENOUGH CONTAINER.**



Travel Day

You may use Early-Bird Check-In the day prior to your flight. Bring your orders, CAC card, passports, all check-in and carry-on baggage, your pet, and the shipping container. The combined weight of your pet and container may not exceed 150 lbs. Your pet and container will remain in your possession between Early-Bird Check-In and the flight.

You will be charged a fee for your pet's travel upon check-in. The fee is calculated based on the combined weight of your pet/container and destination. This fee can be between \$100-\$369. Fees also apply to in-cabin pets.

When preparing your shipping container for travel, attach the following to the container:

- Copy of the rabies vaccination certificate (NOT THE ORIGINAL)
- Copy of the US Health Certificate (NOT THE ORIGINAL)
- Copy of your flight itinerary
- A feeding schedule for your animal, if your pet is on a special diet
- One copy of your Korean Health Certificate

Animals can be fed up to six hours before the flight. However, to minimize the risk of vomiting, please consult with your veterinarian. Water can be given up to the time of the flight in limited amounts. Walking or exercising your animal before presenting it to the check-in counter for loading is also highly recommended.

After your departure, you will be provided the opportunity to visit, walk, and/or give your pet water if you have a lay-over with a ground time of two hours or more.
